Notice Board	A wood display board with 2 glazed doors erected on the village green opposite Manor Farm. The local OS map is mounted on the reverse side.	Presented to the village by Barningham Women's Institute in 2006. The board is maintained by the Parish Meeting and is for the display of any relevant notice, either formal or informal. After the glazed doors were damaged in a storm, the board was relocated to the village bus-shelter.	£1.00	31 March 2019
Bus Shelter	Stone structure with tile roof and three glazed window. Located opposite the village green, East of the junction of the Greta Bridge Road.	Built in the past 40 years. Barningham Parish Meeting has accepted responsibility for its upkeep.	£1.00	31 March 2019
Telephone box	Former BT phone box, Listed, Grade 2 and traditionally painted green. Located opposite the village green in the forecourt of Post Cottage, the former village Post Office	Ownership transferred to Barningham Parish Meeting during 2010 by BT.	£1.00	31 March 2019
Wharton Salver	A silver plated, inscribed salver on display in the village hall.	An inscribed salver marking the retirement as Rector of William Fitzwilliam Wharton in 1874. Public Seat	A steel and wood bench located adjacent to the village name-sign on Cowclose Lane at the beginning of the open moor.	At the Parish Meeting in November 2017 a resident suggested that the PM accept responsibility for the seat, which required some renovation.
